1. The Root Issue under Sin Romans 1:27–32

Where do you find it hardest to obey God’s truth in your daily life?

When do you tend to justify something you know isn’t right?

2. God “Gave Them Over” Romans 1:24, 26, 28

Have you ever learned something important through the consequences of your choices? What did God show you?

3. The Downward Spiral of Sin Romans 1:29–31

How does drifting away from God show up in everyday sins like envy, pride, gossip, or being unkind? Which sins in Romans 1:29–31 seem most normal or accepted in our culture today? Why do you think that is?

4. Approval of Sin Romans 1:32

In what small or quiet ways might we go along with sin instead of standing for what is right? What makes that temptation strong?

5. Humility Instead of Self-Righteousness Romans 1:18–32

How can we respond to sin in the world with humility instead of pride? What would a humble, gospel-centered response look like?

6. Living as People of the Gospel Romans 1:16

How does remembering what the gospel has done for us change the way we respond to sin in our culture? What are some practical ways we can speak the truth and still be kind?
